### A NOTE FROM PASTOR BILL:

There is always something a bit nostalgic for me about the 4th of July! As it arrives once more, I can't help but reflect on days now long gone when, as a boy, I decorated my bike with red, white, and blue streamers. And, of course, there were always picnics and parties to attend.

Then, there were the 4th of Julys when I drove a convertible in the Catonsville parade, when home from college, with the 4th of July Queen sitting in the back and waving to the crowd as we passed by! And no 4th of July was ever complete unless I watched with my friends and family the anxiously anticipated fireworks as the day faded to night and the evening sky filled with flashing lights, cascading stars, and loud booms that shook the earth. It was and is a special day. It is a day when we remember and celebrate the birth of our country. It is a day when we pause for a moment in time to celebrate FREEDOM!

As recent posters have reminded us, of course, FREEDOM isn't free. So the 4th of July is also a time, in the midst of our various celebrations and traditions, when we need to remember those who made the ultimate sacrifice from Bunker Hill to Afghanistan in defense of freedom - those to whom we all owe so much - the men and women of our armed forces past and present who have not only fought and died to make us free, but who have also fought and died to maintain that freedom. Without their commitment to the cause of freedom and sacrifices to both obtain and keep it, there would be no 4th of July and life for us would certainly be different.

The 4th of July, of course, only comes around once a year. However, as Christians we have the opportunity to celebrate freedom once a week. Every Sunday, you see, is a celebration of Easter. Every Sunday is a day when we gather to worship and praise the victory of Jesus Christ over sin and death - a victory which FREES us from the condemnation we deserve because of our sinful ways, and from the eternal separation from God that death would have been for us had Jesus not experienced the resurrection from the dead that occurred at Easterand that FREEDOM is ours when we put our faith in Jesus.

In the summer of 1984, I received orders to report to the Naval Air Station in Bermuda to relieve for a brief time the chaplain stationed there. Since he and his family were returning to the states, he graciously invited me to bring Nancy and our two young sons along as well and opened his house to us while he was away. Since it was summer, the boys were out of school and it all worked out for us. (Continued on Next Page)

During our time there, we celebrated the 4th of July. Together we sat in little beach chairs on a closed runway of the Naval Air Station to watch the fireworks. It was a tremendous display made even more meaningful and special because we were surrounded that night not just by military hardware, but by military personnel - the men and women who had volunteered to defend our freedom. It was a 4th of July I'll never forget.

When we come together for worship, we can have a similar experience. For in worship we are surrounded by those who know Jesus as their Savior, and who are there with us to worship Him, thank Him, acknowledge His love for us, and strive every other day of the week to bring that love to others as He calls us to do. We are surrounded by those who understand the sacrifice Jesus has made for us all that FREES us from our sins and promises us a new and eternal life with Him.

So celebrate the 4th of July this year, because it is something we should all be celebrating. But celebrate as well, every Sunday, what by the grace of God is a gift that demands celebrating as well - EVERY DAY - the gift of forgiveness and new life!

### **Endowment Fund**

THANK YOU to all who have so generously contributed to the St. Martin's Endowment Fund. We are pleased to report that the Fund has grown to more than \$300,000. In 2018, the Fund generated \$8,351.31 in dividend income which is available for distribution.

In recent months, the FISH program used Endowment funds to assemble 10 Backpacks of Love for the Blue Ribbon Project, an AACO non-profit. The backpacks and supplies in them are distributed to local children who are removed from their homes - usually because of abuse. The items in the bag help them get through the first few days because many times the children take nothing with them when they are removed from the home. FISH also used Endowment funds when they filled 40 plastic shoe boxes with items for children who are in the emergency pediatric unit at Anne Arundel Hospital. Our St. Martin's Youth will be using Endowment funds this summer to assemble 10,000 meals that will stay in the local community. Funds also supported Arden House, the AACO shelter for abused women and the Samaritan House, a home for men recovering from addiction.

If you are aware of a need which may be met through the Endowment Fund, please contact one of the Board Members.

Gifts to the Endowment Fund benefit the Annapolis community in perpetuity and are a wonderful way to honor or remember a loved one. Under the charter for the Fund, principal is not touched - only income is distributed. All gifts are acknowledged, and notes are sent to families of anyone honored or memorialized.

Contributions should be made payable to St. Martin's Endowment Fund and may be placed in the collection plate or sent to the church office. Special envelopes are located in the pews. Contributions to the Endowment Fund may also be made electronically using the Church's on-line giving link. Donations of stocks, bonds, CDs or real estate may also be accepted. All gifts are tax deductible.

# The Chaplain's Corner

Jesus said, "Could you not keep watch with me for one hour?" Matthew 26:40

It's July – summer – rest and refreshment. For a brief period, the hectic pace we keep may slow a bit. During this time, we have opportunity to reflect once more on the teachings of our Lord. One such teaching is prayer.

Prayer is mentioned numerous times in scripture. The word "pray" alone appears 121 times. The Gospels include several references to Jesus' praying. From what we read we realize Our Savior would pray sincerely. To do so he would seek a quiet spot, away from distractions which could interfere with his prayer. He was in conversation with His heavenly Father.

By His teaching and, so important, by His example, Jesus taught us to pray.

Find a place that is quiet. How difficult is that these days? Even as we pray in church a random sound or siren of an emergency vehicle interferes with our quiet space with our Father. A door closes. Someone drops something.

Pray to your Heavenly Father. Thank Him for the blessings we have received. Thank Him for all He has done for us. Ask Him to help us serve Him better by following the example our Lord Jesus set for us.

In June we celebrated a baptism. Parents were commended to: live with *them* among God's faithful people, bring *them* to the word of God and the holy supper, *teach them* the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments, place in *their* hands the holy scriptures, and nurture *them* in faith and prayer.

Prayer *is* important in our life of faith, as The *Praying Hands* above, reminds us. Surprisingly, this image, over 500 years old, was drawn, as an initial sketch for a larger work, by Albrecht Dürer, and has remained an inspiration to this day.

Prayer – so powerful, so meaningful, so purposeful – is a command of our Lord. Teaching the practice of quiet prayer to our children also is a command. And with His command, our Lord gives us His promise.

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." Matthew 28:19-20


