A Special Note from Pastor Bill:

As many of you know, there is a young lady who visits us on Sundays (and sometimes during the week). She comes to worship, and she often attends FISH as well.

Unfortunately, she is a rather troubled young woman, and she has often caused many of us some concern, which includes a concern relative to one's personal safety.

After frequent conversations with her care-giver and the police, we have been advised that the best thing we can do to be of help to her is to obtain a Restraining Order from the court. This is something I have been reluctant to do for many weeks now, and something both Larry and Deb (President and Vice-President of the Congregation Council respectively) have been reluctant to do as well.

Recent events, however, have led me to reconsider the Restraining Order and Larry has reconsidered as well. Parents of the children attending the St. Martin's School have raised concerns, as have parents and participants involved with our FISH program, and worshippers attending our services.

After consulting on a nearly bi-weekly or more basis with her therapist, I have come to the realization, as expressed by the therapist countless times, that taking this action may facilitate the possibility of this young woman getting the help she really needs. Just yesterday, as we concluded one of our conversations, he thanked me profusely for considering this action, because she does need more help than what the local agency can provide.

Still, it is with a heavy heart that I pursue this course, even though I realize that it is what needs to be done for her sake, even more than ours. I just wanted you all to know and ask that you keep her in your prayers!
