Notes from the September Meeting of the Congregation Council:

The September 17, 2019 meeting of the Congregation Council was opened with devotions by Vice President Deb Mangin.

The Minutes from the August 2019 were approved.

REPORTS:

<u>Treasurer</u>: We are currently down \$28,000. The school is projecting a deficit for the year. Forms for those needing to submit requests for the 2020 budget will be sent out soon.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

<u>School Board:</u> School is off to a great start. Back to School night was held on 12 September and was well attended. Four open house dates have been scheduled.

<u>Worship & Music:</u> The new sound system has been getting rave reviews. However, some adjustments need to be made and that will be addressed when those who installed the system will worship with us on 22 September.

<u>Christian Education:</u> The second year for FISH started on 9 September as did Confirmation. Mary Rosekrans and Sara Wetz are teaching Confirmation this year. A TV was donated for the Library/Lounge and will be utilized for Bible studies, Kids Time, Confirmation, and streaming worship services into the Library/Lounge on days when we have larger worship services.

<u>Stewardship</u>: The committee met on 3 September to plan the Stewardship emphasis for the coming months. A lot of good suggestions have been made and a plan is developing. A report will be given to the congregation at the congregational meeting on 22 September.

<u>Fellowship:</u> Plans have been made for Oktoberfest on 6 October, and for the Veterans Day service planned for 10 November. The committee would like to have some new members, so if anyone would like to help plan the fellowship activities of the church please call the office and let us know.

<u>Youth:</u> The service for the blessing of the Pets on 9 September went well, was well received, and received positive feedback. Trunk or Treat is being planned. In the summer of 2020, there will be a Work Camp for the youth.

<u>Property:</u> No Report Memorials: No Report

Evangelism: The brochures distributed in the spring will

be redistributed this fall.

<u>PASTOR'S REPORT:</u> Pastor Bill has continued to visit, give home communions, attend various meetings, visited with the youth during their weeklong camp in August and went on a field trip with them. He also spoke at two memorial services – one for a friend, and one for a member of St. John in Linthicum. He will also be speaking and offering a prayer on 28 September at the beginning of the 30th annual Linthicum Community Fair (which he started 30 years ago), and preaching at the 100th Anniversary Celebration Service at St. John on 29 September. He encouraged the Council to consider the development of more fellowship activities here at St. Martin's.

OLD BUSINESS: The Church Constitution has been revised as needed and was approved for presentation to the congregation at the Annual Meeting in January. Permits have been issued for the antenna in the steeple with a starting date set for after the first of the year. There is, however, an issue to be settled related to the historical society.

NEW BUSINESS: The Giant Food Store has offered to give flu shots and other shots here at the church. Paula will investigate this further, but a tentative date has been set for 11 October from 3-6 p.m. More information will be made available as it comes in. The school golf tournament is set for 10 October. This is a huge fund raiser for the school so is hoped that many will play. The election of officers took place with Larry Laubscher being elected President, Deb Mangin, Vice-President, and Sara Wetz, Secretary.

St. Martin's Dedications Flowers, Bulletin, Candle

St. Martin's offers its members several opportunities to make dedications in honor or memory of loved ones, special events, such as weddings, baptisms, first communions or confirmations, or just to the Glory of God! These include flowers on Sundays to enhance the beauty of the sanctuary, the sanctuary candle (the large seven-day candle), and bulletins.

Flower arrangements are ordered from Gateway Florist for a cost of fifty dollars. Many of our members have preferred to make their own arrangements from flowers they purchase themselves or from flowers from their yards. Several vases that can be used are available in the sacristy or, if you choose to use your own vase, it will be returned to you. Please make sure you indicate on the dedication form if you would like to have flowers delivered from Gateway Florist or if you will be providing your own flowers.

The cost of the bulletin dedication is fifteen dollars; and the candle dedication is twelve dollars. Each Sunday, the bulletin announces the dedications that have been requested, be it flowers, bulletin or candle. The announcement includes the dedication provided by the giver and the giver's name, if desired.

You can find the Dedication Envelopes for flowers, bulletin and candle on the bulletin board across from the Library Lounge. Instructions for dedications and payments are on the envelope.

The Chaplain's Corner

For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God—. Ephesians 2:8

September was hot, dry and busy, but now we look to October. I don't know about you, but in October my Lutheran roots always seem to point me to Martin Luther and the Reformation. Martin was a man whose faith was firm and whose conviction was solid: Faith alone! Grace alone! Scripture (Word) alone! I think we all would recognize "*Luther's Rose*" but I wonder how many of us remember its components. This year, as we ready ourselves for our wonderful Oktoberfest celebration and for Reformation Sunday, I thought I'd share a refresher – excerpts from a letter penned by Martin Luther, himself, in July, 1530. Martin wrote:

As you desire to know whether my painted seal, which you sent to me, has hit the mark, I shall answer most amiably and tell you my original thoughts and reason about why my seal is a symbol of my theology. The first should be a black cross in a heart, which retains its natural color, so that I myself would be reminded that faith in the Crucified saves us. "For one who believes from the heart will be justified.". Although it is indeed a black cross, which mortifies and which should also cause pain, it leaves the heart in its natural color. It does not corrupt nature, that is, it does not kill but keeps alive. "The just shall live by faith" ($\frac{\text{Romans }1:17}{\text{Nome }1:17}$) but by faith in the crucified. Such a heart should stand in the middle of a white rose, to show that faith gives joy, comfort, and peace. In other words, it places the believer into a white, joyous rose, for this faith does not give peace and joy like the world gives (John 14:27). That is why the rose should be white and not red, for white is the color of the spirits and the angels (cf. Matthew 28:3; John 20:12). Such a rose should stand in a sky-blue field, symbolizing that such joy in spirit and faith is a beginning of the heavenly future joy, which begins already, but is grasped in hope, not yet revealed. And around this field is a golden ring, symbolizing that such blessedness in Heaven lasts forever and has no end. Such blessedness is exquisite, beyond all joy and goods, just as gold is the most valuable, most precious and best metal. This is my compendium theologiae [summary of theology]. May Christ, our beloved Lord, be with your spirit until the life hereafter. Amen.

Couldn't have said it better, myself! Blessings and Happy Reformation!

For one believes with the heart and so is justified, and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved. Romans 10:10
