Today we welcome a dear brother in Christ, **the Reverend David B. Rodriguez** as our guest preacher for Consecration Sunday. Born in Walnut Creek, CA, Pastor Rodriguez graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of California in Berkeley, CA in 1980. He graduated from Fuller Theological Seminary in Pasadena, CA in 1984 with a Master of Divinity degree. In 1990, he graduated from Princeton Theological Seminary, Princeton, NJ with a Master of Theology degree.

He was ordained in the Presbyterian Church (USA) in 1984. He has served churches in Fontana, CA, Hollister, CA, and Pacific Grove, CA, and Ukiah, CA. He has led multiple stewardship campaigns and capital campaigns during his ministry.

He is also a chaplain in the United States Navy with the rank of Captain. He has served as a chaplain for units in the United States Marine Corps, the United States Coast Guard, as well as the United States Navy. He has also been mobilized and deployed to Iraq (2005), Kuwait (2007-2008) and most recently to Djibouti (2017-2018). He is currently serving as the Naval District Washington Chaplain with a reserve posting as Deputy Chaplain for Commander, Navy Installations Command.
